The **COVID-19** pandemic has interrupted classroom learning for at least **9** out of **10** students worldwide

> **191** countries have closed all their schools, affecting over **1.5 billion** students from pre-primary to tertiary education

Almost **half** of all students affected worldwide face **barriers to online learning** during school closures

50% of learners 826 million do not have a household computer

The pandemic highlights the **need for more trained teachers** n low income countries, there is only **1 trained teacher** for **56 pupils** in primary education; in **sub-Saharan Africa** it is **1** to **60**
